Luke 10:25–37 (ESV)

<sup>25</sup> And behold, a lawyer stood up to put him to the test, saying, “Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?” <sup>26</sup> He said to him, “What is written in the Law? How do you read it?” <sup>27</sup> And he answered, “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself.” <sup>28</sup> And he said to him, “You have answered correctly; do this, and you will live.” <sup>29</sup> But he, desiring to justify himself, said to Jesus, “And who is my neighbor?” <sup>30</sup> Jesus replied, “A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and he fell among robbers, who stripped him and beat him and departed, leaving him half dead. <sup>31</sup> Now by chance a priest was going down that road, and when he saw him he passed by on the other side. <sup>32</sup> So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. <sup>33</sup> But a Samaritan, as he journeyed, came to where he was, and when he saw him, he had compassion. <sup>34</sup> He went to him and bound up his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he set him on his own animal and brought him to an inn and took care of him. <sup>35</sup> And the next day he took out two denarii and gave them to the innkeeper, saying, ‘Take care of him, and whatever more you spend, I will repay you when I come back.’ <sup>36</sup> Which of these three, do you think, proved to be a neighbor to the man who fell among the robbers?” <sup>37</sup> He said, “The one who showed him mercy.” And Jesus said to him, “You go, and do likewise.”

## Recognizing our Brokenness: Confession of Sin Public Reading

Merciful Father, when we consider how the lawyer tried to shrink your law to justify himself, but how your Son expanded the law to its full size, we realize how “lawyer-like” we are. We have two problems. We have tried to reduce your desires for us so we could meet them—thinking and acting like we can come to you without a priest. And as a result, shunning your mercy, we have also been weak in mercy to others, both in our actions and our attitudes. Forgive us for maligning your goodness and failing in the compassion you desire us to show.

Teach us to treasure Jesus, your Priest who fulfills your whole law for us. Since we indeed have true earthly and eternal inheritance through Him, enable us to hear the fullness of your call upon our lives. Let your mercy to us fuel our mercy to others. Help us to be priestly in this world.

## Private Reflection

### Assurance of Pardon

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:8–9 (ESV)

## Remembering Jesus with Bread and Cup: Lord’s Supper (Juice in the outer ring; wine in inner rings)

(The first and third Sundays of the month, we come forward as families, groups and individuals to receive the bread and cup and for a prayer of blessing. The second, fourth and fifth Sundays, we remain seated, with time to personally remember Jesus’ death and resurrection for us with the bread and cup. Whether you take the elements or not, we encourage you to either come forward for prayer or use the time for personal reflection about your relationship with Jesus.)
