Public Reading

Father we long to be right--blameless, even unblamable, spotless inside and out. But when we find a rare moment of rightness, we lose even that when we wield it with prideful self-importance, wounding those around us. We remain wrong. We pretend, we run, we strive, but we refuse to live in the rightness you offer by faith in your son Jesus. Forgive us.

Convince us to come to you, seeking the rightness you give by faith. Teach us to live out of the righteousness you have counted to us. Since it comes by faith and not works, let it make us beautiful and humble to others; because it is your gift that we might know you, let it be bold and faithful in us. Grow our faith in your son, Jesus, who has won our access to know and love you.

Remembering Jesus with Bread and Cup: Lord's Supper

Jesus called those who find their life in His death and resurrection to receive the bread and cup as a tangible sign to remember and be strengthened by His Gospel. It is a spiritual meal for all who believe in Him.

On the first and third Sundays of the month, we come forward as families, groups and individuals to receive the bread and cup and for a prayer of blessing. The second, fourth and fifth Sundays, we remain seated, with time to personally remember Jesus' death and resurrection for us with the bread and cup. Whether you take the elements or not, we encourage you to either come forward for prayer or use the time for personal reflection about your relationship with Jesus. Juice is in the outer ring; wine is in inner rings.
